Bible Bowl

(RULES FOR THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI)

I. FORMAT/GAME OVERVIEW

1. Bible Bowl is a question and answer game played between at least two players.
2. Points are scored by correctly answering questions asked by the convener or his designee or his designate.
3. There are two types of questions: toss-ups and swords drills. Each question is worth ten (10) points.
4. Every Bible Bowl is run by the convener or his designee, who has the final say in all matters pertaining to the management of the match and implementation of the rules.
5. The answers provided by the National and State Baptist Laymen's Movement are the official answers.

II. RULES

1. The contest will be divided into two major parts:
 - a. Questions & Answers
 - b. Sword Drill
2. Questions will consist of events in the Bible, names, places, life of Christ and other Bible personalities.
3. There will be four (4) six-minute quarters
4. The First and Third quarters will be Questions & Answers. The Second and Fourth quarters will be Bible Drill.
5. A person appointed by the State Laymen President will put the Questions together, and the questions will be presented to the convener or his designee just prior to the Bible Bowl in a sealed envelope.
6. Contestants' age must be eight (8) years or older; must be in high school or in graduation year. Grouping will be according to grades: Group 1 will consist of grades two (2) through six (6); Group two will be grades seven (7) through nine (9); Group three will be grades ten (10) through twelve (12).

7. Each local church can have only one contestant competing at the Super Men's Conference in the three categories (grades 2 – 6, grades 7- 9, and grades 10 – 12). Verification of eligibility must be done by the district association president.
8. Each contestant must be a member of the General Missionary Baptist State Convention of Mississippi, Inc. (G.M..B.S.C.)
9. Any person that is more than ten (10) minutes late automatically forfeits the match, unless otherwise approved by the convener (usually for travel or weather emergencies).
10. Each half, consisting of two quarters, begins with the convener (or his designee) reading the supplied scrip. The reading of the first question signals the start of each quarter and the time starts as soon as the reading begins.
11. At the end of each half the statistician verifies the score and it is declared official.
12. A player whose conduct is unsportsmanlike or who disrupts game play will be warned once. This warning is in effect for the duration of the competition. A second violation will result in the player's ejection from the competition.
13. Players must signal and be recognized before beginning their answer. Once a contestant has been recognized, he must immediately begin their answer. If the convener or his designee completes the reading of the question, then players are given approximately 3 seconds from the time the convener or his designee finishes reading to signal and must answer immediately once they are recognized.
14. A contestant may interrupt the reading of a toss-up before the convener or his designee has completed it. Once the contestant has signaled, the convener or his designee will stop reading. The contestant is recognized and given the opportunity to answer.
15. If the response is ruled incorrect, the contestant is penalized 5 points. The convener or his designee should finish for the other contestant(s) by resuming the question from a logical point.
16. If the remaining contestant(s) also interrupts and answers incorrectly, no penalty is assessed. There is only one 5 point penalty per question.
17. If an answer is given before the contestant is recognized, it is ruled incorrect and the contestant is penalized 5 points.
18. If a contestant does not answer immediately, a judge will call "time." A response given after time is called is not accepted and the contestant is penalized 5 points.
19. If the half or the game ends while a question is being read, the game stops and neither contestant may respond. However, if a contestant has signaled before the end of the match, he is recognized and may answer.

III. RESOLVING GAME DISCREPANCIES

1. If a contestant (or his mentor) feels an error has been made, he must wait until the end of the quarter to bring this to the attention of the game officials.
2. The game officials will review the discrepancy and adjust the point totals in accordance with their decision. The outcome of the review and resultant score change should be announced before the start of the second half.
3. Discrepancies arising in the second half are reviewed only if the number of points in questions would affect the outcome of the game.
4. The only points in question are those points awarded or not awarded in error. Intangibles issues like momentum are not considered.
5. In most cases, discrepancies should be resolved by the addition or subtraction of points and/or the playing of additional questions without the clock. Replaying a half or game should only occur in extreme situations, such as one plagued by numerous discrepancies, poor officiating (the convener or his designee has the authority to replace game officials) or equipment malfunctions.
6. At the end of each competition each player must shake the hand of each game official and competitor.

IV. PERSONNEL (GAME OFFICIALS)

1. Convener or his designee – presides over the Bible Bowl and administers the Questions & Answers and Sword Drill
2. Judges (3) – responsible for designating which boy pressed the buzzer/bell first (if there is no automatic lockout), allowing him the opportunity to answer. The judges are responsible for determining if the question was answered in acceptable Biblical Baptist Doctrine.
3. Timekeepers (1) – there shall be a timekeeper to monitor the time for each six-minute quarter and one to monitor that each question is answered and scripture given within ten seconds.
4. Statistician (1) – shall tabulate the scores of each contestant and compare them at the end of each quarter for parity. Also, the statistician should advise the convener or his designee immediately after the Bible Bowl has ended if there is a tie with the first, second and third place contestants. If the score is tied at the end of the game, the tie is broken by a sudden-death play-off of toss-up or bible drill question. The first correct answer scores 10 points and wins the game. Incorrect interruption losses 5 points and the game. Toss-up questions continue until a score change breaks the tie.

V. ACCEPTABLE ANSWERS

1. On a toss-up, the first response given is the one that counts. If a contestant gives more than one piece of information, the convener or his designee must evaluate the first answer only.
2. Unless otherwise stated in the question, players may use abbreviated answers, such as last names only, acronyms, etc. However, more may be required than just the first name. Mary (the mother of Jesus) would not be an acceptable answer for Mary (Magdalene).
3. If a player spells an answer to a question which does not ask for spelling, it should be considered correct, as long as he spells the answer correctly.
4. If the convener or his designee inadvertently gives an answer to a toss-up without giving either contestant a chance to respond, the convener or his designee simply reads the next toss-up.
5. If someone in the audience shouts out an answer, the convener or his designee throws out the question and reads the next toss-up.

VI. QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

The contestant that presses the buzzer first will be allowed to answer the question asked by the convener. If the correct answer is given, ten points will be awarded, the lock out system cleared and the next question is asked to all contestants. If the answer is incorrect, five points will be deducted, the lock out system cleared, and the remaining contestants will have the opportunity to buzz in and answer the question. If no contestant answers within 5 seconds, the judge will call "Time" and the next question will be asked.

VII. SWORD DRILL

The same rules apply with the addition of the use of the Bible.

1. All Bibles are to remain closed and all hands must be on the Bible; one hand on top and one hand on the bottom.
2. The contestant cannot rest the Bible on the desk or table. When the convener says, "GO", the contestant must then find the scripture and then press the buzzer.
3. Plaques, Certificates and Gifts will be awarded.

CONVENER'S SCRIPTS

The convener (or his designee) is the reflection of all your efforts in organizing your competition. The convener must be familiar with all the rules of the game and how to handle them. Only in an emergency should the judge or other officials have to step in. The convener must be familiar with all the questions: proper phrasing (so that the meaning of the question is clear), proper pronunciation (especially on difficult words, foreign phrases and names), and the answers (including acceptable alternate answers). This is a performance. The better the show, the more entertaining it is for everyone. While it is important to have fun with the game, remember that the players and the smooth flow of the game are of primary importance. These scripts are intended to give the convener the key phrases in running the game. Be authoritative but not intrusive and the game will run smoothly.

OPENING SCRIPT

"Welcome to "THE BIBLE BOWL". This match features young Christian men from various district associations. Please buzz in and tell us who you are and where you are from." (*Players introduce themselves and test buzzers*). "Now, here's how we play. There are two types of questions: toss-ups and sword drills, each worth 10 points apiece. On both types of questions you must signal and be recognized before answering. An incorrect answer and the question go to your opponents. You may interrupt a toss-up and sword drill but if you do and your answer is wrong, you lose 5 points and I will finish the question for the other players. The game is played in four six minutes quarters. If a quarter ends while I'm asking a question, that's it. If you have begun your answer, or signaled on a toss-up or sword drill, you may complete that one answer only. "You are playing for ten points. Here's your question." (*Clock starts*)

STARTING THE SECOND HALF

"We're about to start the second half. The score stands at (read the names and scores for each player). When the buzzer sounds at the end of this half, the game is over. If it sounds while I'm asking a question, that's it. If it sounds while you're answering a question, you may complete that one answer only. If you have signaled on a question, you will be recognized and allowed to give your answer. The person that's ahead at the end of the game is the winner. Good luck to all participants." You're playing for ten points and here's your question." (*Clock starts*)

AT THE END OF THE GAME

"That's it. The game is over. We'll confirm the scores and announce the winner." (*Score is validated*) "It's official. The final score is _____. _____ is the winner! Congratulations to all participants." (*Make any other announcements, such as a preview of the next game.*)
